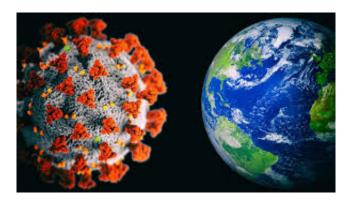

Jennifer Morgan, Executive Director, Greenpeace International, says:

Meanwhile, NASA has been monitoring environmental signals from the global response to COVID-19 with good news for the planet! Satellite data for March 2020 show <u>a 30% drop in air pollution</u> over the Northeast US. But the picture for carbon emissions may not be so rosy, according to <u>Grist</u>. We'll need to keep up the good fight for structural changes and smart policies in the coming months and years to ensure a better future for our children.
